High school senior Quentin "Q" Jacobsen basks in the predictable boringness of his life until the beautiful and exciting Margo Roth Spiegelman, his neighbor and classmate, takes him on a midnight adventure and then disappears.

*Please Ignore Vera Dietz* by A.S. King **yF Kin**

When her best friend, whom she secretly loves, betrays her and then dies under mysterious circumstances, high school senior Vera Dietz struggles with secrets that could help clear his name.

*Miss Peregrine's Home for Peculiar Children* by Ransom Riggs **yF Rig**
