Books for Bibliophiles for Kids

If you love books, you probably love reading about them, too. Check out this week's list of book-themed books.

Book by Kristine O'Connell George (E Geo)

Simple words and pictures capture a small child's first encounter with a book.

A Book by Mordicai Gerstein (E Ger)

Among a family who lives in a book, the youngest daughter is the only one who doesn't have a story to belong to, so she sets out among fairy tales, adventures, mysteries, histories, science fiction, and others to track down her story.

Help! We Need a Title! by Henre Tullet (E Tul)

Presents a not-quite-finished story featuring sketched characters who are surprised by the reader and who attempt to track down their author in the hope of finding a happy ending.

The Reader by Amy Hest (E Hes)

A boy and his dog hike to the top of a very tall, snowy hill where they play, enjoy a snack, and then share their favorite book before sledding home.

The Snatchabook by Helen Docherty (E Doc)

The woodland animals of Burrow Down are ready for a bedtime story, but where are the books?

We are in a Book! by Mo Willems (E Wil)

When Piggie discovers that she and Gerald, the Elephant, are in a book and she can make the reader say a funny word out loud, Gerald is tickled pink, but they begin to wonder what will happen when the story is over.

Wild About Books by Judy Sierra (E Sie)

A librarian named Molly McGrew introduces the animals in the zoo to the joy of reading when she drives her bookmobile to the zoo by mistake.
