Goal 1: Create in demand collections

The library will develop it's collections with a focus on items that will add value to you and your family.

- Add new item types to the collection
- Expand e-material selection
- Reduce wait time for materials
- Promote public awareness of library materials
- Solicit input from the community to determine needs and interests

Goal 2: Improve your library experience

The library will strive to offer a safe, welcoming space for all users.

- Add ADA accessibility building features
- Increase the book store space and add merchandise
- Expand access to library services in surrounding towns
- Increase staff training on emerging technologies and customer service
- Adapt the physical space to best support user's facility needs


Goal 3: Build a more literate community


The library will work to improve quality of life for all of the area residents by increasing literacy rates as literacy is the foundation of a thriving society.











Are the library's hours compatible with your schedule?


If our library hours are not compatible with your schedule, what times work for you?























One-on-one Interviews

Our one-on-one interviews revealed many recurring themes about the type of community people desire to live in and what they need from their library.

Residents want to live in communities where:

- People are able to age in place
- The school system is strong
- · There are a wide variety of recreational activities for people of all ages
- Residents take an active role in their town's development

Residents want their library to have:

- Strong collections that contain up-to-date material both in print and digital
- Programs for children that promote literacy
- Opportunities for teens and young people to be involved in town activities
- Digital literacy assistance for all residents in need of technology instruction
- A space that is welcoming and full of life
- Events that bring people together to help build a strong sense of community
- Collaboration with local businesses, schools, and nonprofit organizations
- More visibility in the community through increased services outside of Ellsworth and a presence at local events

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
